Objective & Scope of the Audit

The objectives of the academic and administrative audit (AAA) as an independent assessment of the College by Internal Audit Committee with an external expert comprising of the above members. Accordingly, the audit team decided to look into the prevailing situation at the College along the following aspects in course of the audit.

Scope

- ✓ Methodology of teaching and learning conducted for the different courses run by the College
- ✓ Functioning of the Laboratories and Computer Facilities
- ✓ Examination and Evaluation system
- ✓ Activities of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell
- ✓ Library, sport and other facilities

- ✓ Outreach Programmes conducted by the College including the NCC and NSS Programmes
- ✓ Opportunities and Scope of improvements in the major functional areas

The team is empowered and expected to express views and give suggestions for the improvement of the systems being followed by the College.

Methodology

The academic audit is based on

- Annual Reports of the Departments
- Annual Quality Assurance Report AQAR of the institution
- Feedback from stakeholders
- Visits to Departments

The Audit team began their visit on July 25, 2020 to various departments and facilities, for brief interactions with the faculty of each department, the students of the department streams and the support staff. Visits to the laboratories, Computer facilities, the Library and some of the other facilities of the college were accommodated in the schedule arranged by the IQAC Committee of the college to enable the Audit Committee to acquire relevant first-hand information. Based on the information/data gathered from the available documents and the interactions afforded with the different component of the institution, the Audit Committee has made a sincere endeavour to put forward certain views, observations and recommendations in the body of this report with expectations that these recommendations, when implemented, will best serve the interest of the College as intended.

Observations

Observations based on the documents provided by department and meeting with the different stakeholders of the college are given below.

5.1 Courses

The courses offered by the College is in three different streams arts, science and commerce. It is evidenced that the number of applications the College received for admissions in Arts and Science at UG level is remarkably high. The academic and non-academic credit points for the course offered by the college, number of teachers and students in different departments are shown in Table 2, 3 and 4.

- ✓ Introduction of value added courses

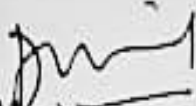
General Conclusion

- ✓ Student discipline is good.

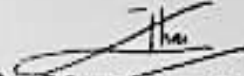

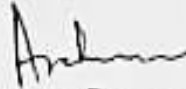
